Is Father's Day as Popular as Mother's Day?

The short answer is no. In Canada, Mother's Day consistently drives significantly higher consumer spending—shoppers spend roughly 60% less on Father's Day.

This gap isn't about fathers being less valued. It's largely shaped by history, culture, and how each holiday developed. Mother's Day was officially recognized in 1914, while Father's Day didn't become a national holiday until 1972—nearly six decades later. That later start has influenced how deeply each day is embedded in tradition.

Cultural expectations also play a role. Mothers have long been viewed as primary caregivers and emotional anchors, while fathers have often been seen as providers. As a result, Mother's Day tends to emphasize rest, appreciation, and being celebrated, while many fathers prefer a more low-key approach, sometimes even avoiding a "big fuss."

There are also clear differences in how each holiday is marketed. Mother's Day is one of the largest retail events of the year, promoted with emotionally driven campaigns featuring flowers, cards, brunches, and spa experiences. Father's Day marketing, by comparison, is often more limited and focused on practical gifts like tools, gadgets, and BBQ gear, without the same emotional or experiential appeal.

Celebration styles differ too. Mother's Day is often marked by planned events—family gatherings, outings, or special experiences. Father's Day is typically more casual, perhaps a simple meal or a thoughtful but modest gift. While the appreciation is there, the tone tends to be quieter.

The difference really shows up in what kinds of gifts people buy – it's almost like the two holidays have completely different "styles".

Mother's day gifts tend to be emotional, experience-based, or pampering. The number one gift is flowers or plants, followed by jewelry, dining out, spa day, clothing, or a personalized or sentimental gift. The vibe is lavish, memorable, thoughtful, emotional, appreciation-focused to make mother feel special or cared for.

Father's day gifts tend to be practical, hobby-based, or simple, the most popular being a simple card, clothing, food or BBQ-related item, tools or gadgets. The vibe is practical, straightforward and is often practical and utility-driven—reflecting usefulness more than sentiment.

All this said, as the gap between traditional parenting roles is evolving and celebrations are changing. Many families are putting equal thought and effort into both celebrations. In some households, Father's Day is just as meaningful—it simply reflects personal values and traditions.

Let's keep our Father's in Mind this Father's Day – June 21



Bible verses for Father's Day.

As we reflect on Father's Day, it's meaningful to remember its spiritual roots. The holiday is often credited to Sonora Smart Dodd, whose deep faith and gratitude for her widowed father raising six children alone on a farm, inspired her to advocate for a day that honours fathers through recognition and prayer.

These scriptures offer encouragement and perspective—not just for one Sunday in June, but throughout the year. Fathers play a lasting role in shaping not only their children's lives today, but the generations that follow.

This verse reminds us that when fathers lead their families with reverence for the Lord, they provide a safe haven for their children, nurturing them with love and security:

Proverbs 14:26 - "Whoever fears the LORD has a secure fortress, and for their children it will be a refuge." Proverbs 20:7 - "A righteous person acts with integrity; his children who come after him will be happy."

Fathers take great pride in seeing their children grow in wisdom and character: Proverbs 23:24 - "The father of a righteous child has great joy; a man who fathers a wise son rejoices in him." Proverbs 22:6 - "Start a youth out on his way; even when he grows old he will not depart from it."

The parable of the Prodigal Son illustrates a father's boundless love and forgiveness: Luke 15:20 - "But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him."

The fictional character of Spider-man provides an interesting statement for us to think on: "With great privilege comes great responsibility", which is what God was telling men nearly 3,000 years ago. You get the privilege of raising your kids, but you also have the responsibility of doing it the right way—God's way.

Proverbs 4:11-12: "I will guide you in the way of wisdom and I will lead you in upright paths. When you walk, your steps will not be hampered, and when you run, you will not stumble."

Not just on Father's Day, we remember the profound influence fathers have—through leadership, love, and faith—every single day.

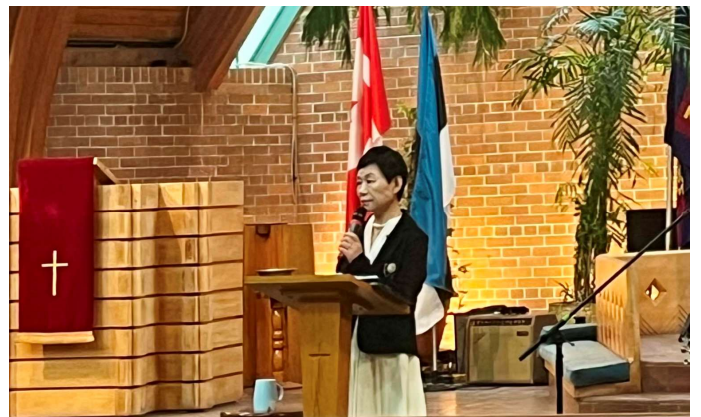

"One morning my father didn't get up and go to work. He went to the hospital and died the next day. I hadn't thought that much about him before.

He was just someone who left and came home and seemed glad to see everyone at night. He opened the jar of pickles when no one else could. He was the only one in the house who wasn't afraid to go into the basement by himself. He cut himself shaving, but no one kissed it or got excited about it. It was understood that when it rained, he got the car and brought it around to the door. When anyone was sick, he went out to get the prescription filled. He took lots of pictures ... but he was never in them. Whenever I played house, the mother doll had a lot to do. I never knew what to do with the daddy doll, so I had him say, "I'm going off to work now" and threw him under the bed.

The funeral was in our living room and a lot of people came and brought all kinds of good food and cakes. We had never had so much company before. I went to my room and felt under the bed for the daddy doll. When I found him I dusted him off and put him on my bed. He never did anything. I didn't know his leaving would hurt so much."
